RE: Open Letter of Reference For Ms Amber Clark


To whom it may concern,

I am pleased to recommend Ms Amber Clark to you for employment. This year has been one of transition for Amber, as she has had to adapt to new curricula in the Middle School, as well as the interpersonal and development stage needs of our middle school students. Amber has met these challenges with great enthusiasm and has experienced many successes.

I have worked closely with Amber as the academic mentor for MSc course in multidisciplinary studies, which will ultimately culminate with a certification in teacher leadership.
